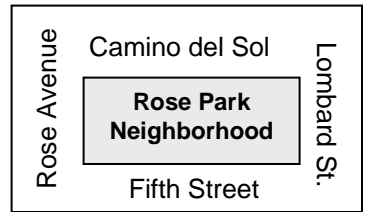

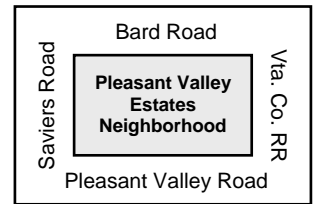

COMMUNITY ASKED TO HELP SET OXNARD'S ENERGY EFFICIENCY GOALS AT MAY 14 WORKSHOP

Community businesses and residents are invited to participate in one of two interactive workshops next Monday, May 14 to identify and discuss opportunities and barriers to improving energy conservation as part of the City of Oxnard's Community Energy Action Plan (Community EAP) development process.

The workshops provide an opportunity to learn about local and statewide energy efficiency goals, review energy use statistics and trends, and provide input to ensure that the plan is representative of the community and represents feasible actions that help the City develop realistic energy and sustainability goals.

Examples of energy use statistics include:

- A 50,000 square foot office building of average operating efficiency can reduce operating costs by \$40,000 per year through no-cost and low-cost actions.
- Only 20% of homes built before 1980 are considered well-insulated by the U.S. Department of Energy.
- The industrial sector in California spends more than \$15 billion annually to operate manufacturing systems and equipment such as motors and pumps, compressed air systems, steam and process heating and cooling.

Workshop participants will have the opportunity to weigh in on various strategies that the City could research for cost-effectiveness in our unique temperate climate, and then promote throughout the community. Information and educational materials will be available for those who would like to learn more about energy efficiency practices.

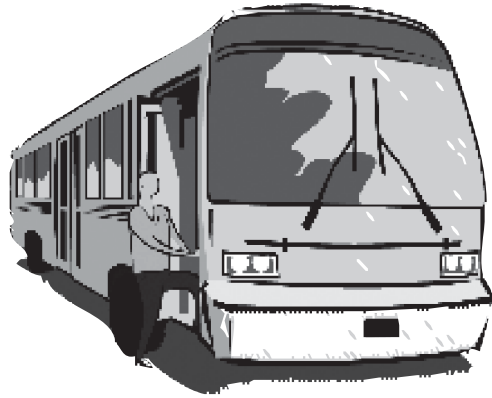
**Ventura 101 Freeway Closure At Rice Ave Area
Set For Four Consecutive Nights**

Construction crews are scheduled to close a portion of the Ventura 101 freeway for four consecutive nights. The work will begin with a complete closure of the northbound side of the freeway on Monday, May 14 and Tuesday, May 15 starting at approximately 11:45 PM – 5 AM the next morning. Then, on Wednesday, May 16 and Thursday, May 17, the work will switch over to the other side for a complete southbound closure from approximately 11:45 PM – 5 AM the next morning, on both nights. The affected areas during all four evenings will be between Del Norte Boulevard and Rose Avenue. The purpose of the closures will allow construction crews to conduct falsework along the new bridge overpass.

All current on-and-off ramps will not be affected during all four nights of work. Detour signs will be in place to help motorists bypass the closed portion of the freeway through city streets.

Work crews are asking motorists to be extra patient when driving through the area and to expect delays. The California Highway Patrol will be on site to assist with any traffic situations.
